



Below are our official answers to your questions:

- *Did you guys know about the community meeting last week, and if you did what were your feelings about it?*
 - The meeting held in Anderson, MO, was a meeting “by invitation only”. Bub’s Inc. was neither notified of this meeting nor invited to attend. We were also made aware by someone who attended the meeting, that an announcement was made at its onset asking that anyone who works for Bub’s or representing Bub’s should make themselves known immediately to be escorted out of the premises by two local law enforcement officials. We would have gladly attended if we would have been invited.

- *It looks like you guys were originally based out of Arkansas, are you still working down there? And if not, what made you relocate to MO?*
 - We are based out of Springdale, Arkansas, and still operate here. Nearly all of the activity that we conduct in Missouri is the land application of organic residuals, biosolids, from our food processing customers. As our business grew, it was becoming more and more difficult to find additional land to permit in NW Arkansas. As such, and for other business considerations, we decided to move the land app part of our business into Missouri.

- *Many residents living along Pump Station Rd. are upset about this company, would you understand why or do you feel like you guys are being perceived incorrectly?*
 - One of our several land application sites is located on Pump Station Road. During times when we are active at that location, there is increased traffic on the road and occasionally, a mild odor can be noticed. We certainly understand that these can be annoying. There have been, however, numerous, erroneous claims made recently stating that we are “dumping” or harming streams or wells in various ways. The only way this can occur is through run-off. DNR has visited our site numerous times, most recently on June 17 and 19 (we were not present) of this year and has issued the following, “During the 2019 visits, Department staff did not observe run-off of land applied material.”

- *I've also been speaking to the DNR about you guys, when was the last time they came out to your facility and what was the interaction like?*
 - The last DNR site visit where we were present was on June 13. We discussed several “best management practices” and were notified of an information request by the department. Our interaction with DNR is always encouraging and supportive. We work closely with DNR to comply with all rules and regulations and quickly move to integrate any suggestions or recommendations they have to improve our land application process.

- *And from your perspective, have you guys seen an impact on the environment since moving your waste company to Anderson?*
 - To clarify, we did not move our company to Anderson, only the land application segment. The land application of organic residuals can have a very positive impact on land as it provides essential nutrients to the soil. The recent flooding in and around

Anderson has been devastating to many parts of the area causing significant impact on the environment.
